Biggs Museum Presents Carson Zullinger: The Line of Beauty

November 7, 2014 – February 26, 2015



Dover, DE (October 2, 2014) – On Friday, November 7, 2014, the Biggs Museum of American Art will present a new feature exhibition entitled Carson Zullinger: *The Line of Beauty*.

Carson Zullinger, a photographer and Delaware native, has been exhibiting his figural and landscape fine-art photographs for forty years.

Zullinger often subordinates his dynamic and thoroughly modern compositions to emphasize traditionally held forms of beauty. *The Line of Beauty* helps to trace his accomplishments in the arts while debuting new works created in response to receiving the coveted Master's level Individual Artist Fellowship from the Delaware Division of Arts.

"[I believe] the body in motion creates a gesture. That gesture tells a story, it contains an emotional content. I pre-visualize a composition,

often from my dreams, and create a photographic image in collaboration with professional models. The shape the body takes to explore my subconscious narrative is the line," shared artist Carson Zullinger about his photography.

The exhibition First Look will take place on First Friday, November 7, 2014 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. The exhibition opening reception will take place Saturday, November 15, 2014 from 3 p.m. – 5



p.m. A series of programming has also been planned in conjunction with the

Exploration of the Line of Beauty Date: Saturday, December 13

The "Line of Beauty" is an expression termed by British artist and satirist, William
Hogarth (1697-1764), in his 1753 treatise on aesthetics entitled The Analysis of
Beauty. Hogarth identified the visual dynamism that can be added to an artistic
composition with contrasting serpentine lines popularized in European arts of the 17th
and 18th centuries. Since then, many artists demonstrate sensuality, emotional
expressiveness, physical transcendence and luxury through the S-shaped line. Biggs
Museum Curator, Ryan Grover, traces the iconography of the "Line of Beauty" to
Carson Zullinger's work with the human figure during this lecture.

This series will explore drawing as a vehicle for the examination, and observation, of the human form. Emphasis will be placed on anatomical structure and formal drawing elements. Techniques and processes developed by various artists including examples from old and modern masters, as well as contemporary artists will be discussed. Live models will be provided.
