Jewels of the Generations: The Legacy of the Loockerman and Bradford Family of Dover February 22, 2012



Dover, DE (February 22, 2012) – The Biggs Museum is pleased to present a full schedule of exhibition programming to accompany the Jewels of the Generations exhibition. A First Look pARTY on Friday, March 2, 2012 will open the exhibition with the opportunity to view the treasures of the Loockerman and Bradford family. This exhibition will feature early American clothing, fashionable Victorian jewelry, European and Asian ceramics, American and European silver, important American and European portraits, and Delaware and Philadelphia made furniture. On Saturday, March 10, learn about the clothing worn by three Loockerman family women dating 1750s to 1810. Historical and Cultural Affairs Curator of Collections, Ann Baker Horsey will establish that the family was living forward through fashion in Dover and beyond. On Wednesday, March 21, Biggs Museum Curator, Ryan Grover, and Delaware Public Archives Specialist, Margaret Dunham, will discuss one of the most interesting and influential families in Dover's history, the Loockerman's. This lecture and gallery walk-through will examine the multi-generational collecting practices of the Locckerman family in Dover from the 1730s to the present. Please bring a bag lunch for this event. All programs listed above will be offered FREE to the public and all ages are welcome. Jewels of the Generations exhibition and programming are partially funded by grants from Delaware Division of the Arts and the Delaware Humanities Forum, a state program for the National Endowment for Humanities.

The Museum will also be offering FREE children's educational programs in conjunction with the *Jewels of the Generations* exhibition during the month of March. On Saturday, March 3 from 2:00-3:00 p.m. *Biggs Kids* (children ages 5-10) will discover the history behind the portrait of Loockerman while being lead through the exhibition. Artist's technique will be discussed and children will have the opportunity to create their own

portraits using tempera paint. On Wednesday, March 14 from 10:00 - 11:00 A.M. *Mini-Masters* (children ages 3-5) will also have the chance to learn the history of Vincent Loockerman concluding their tour with the opportunity to finger paint their own self portrait.

For the first time since the 19th century, part of the collection will be displayed on mannequins within an interior setting including the portrait of Vincent and furniture owned by the family.
